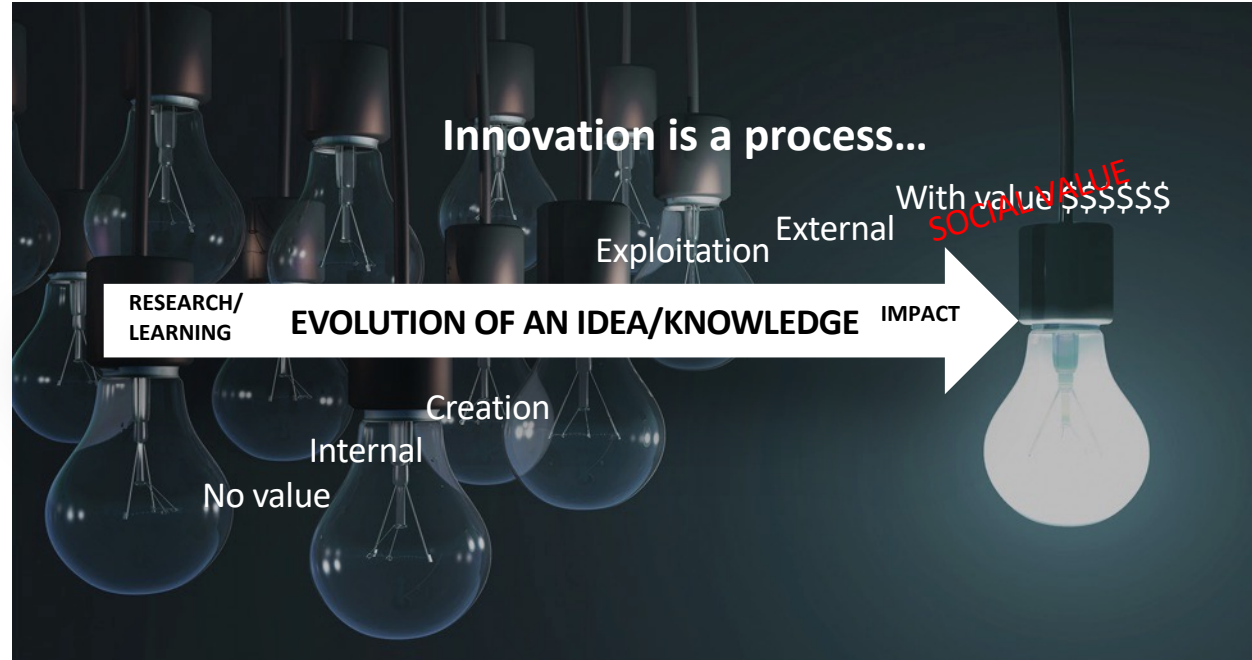

Where are we now?

Researchers and policymakers have come to recognise the crucial role that SI plays in driving social change...

But **Universities** have still to develop effective mechanisms for supporting social innovation at an institutional level through knowledge exchange...

And **social innovators** often do not see the benefits of working with universities – measurement of their success is often anecdotal and lacks due diligence or academic rigour, and as a result they do not attract the kind of investment of commercial innovators...

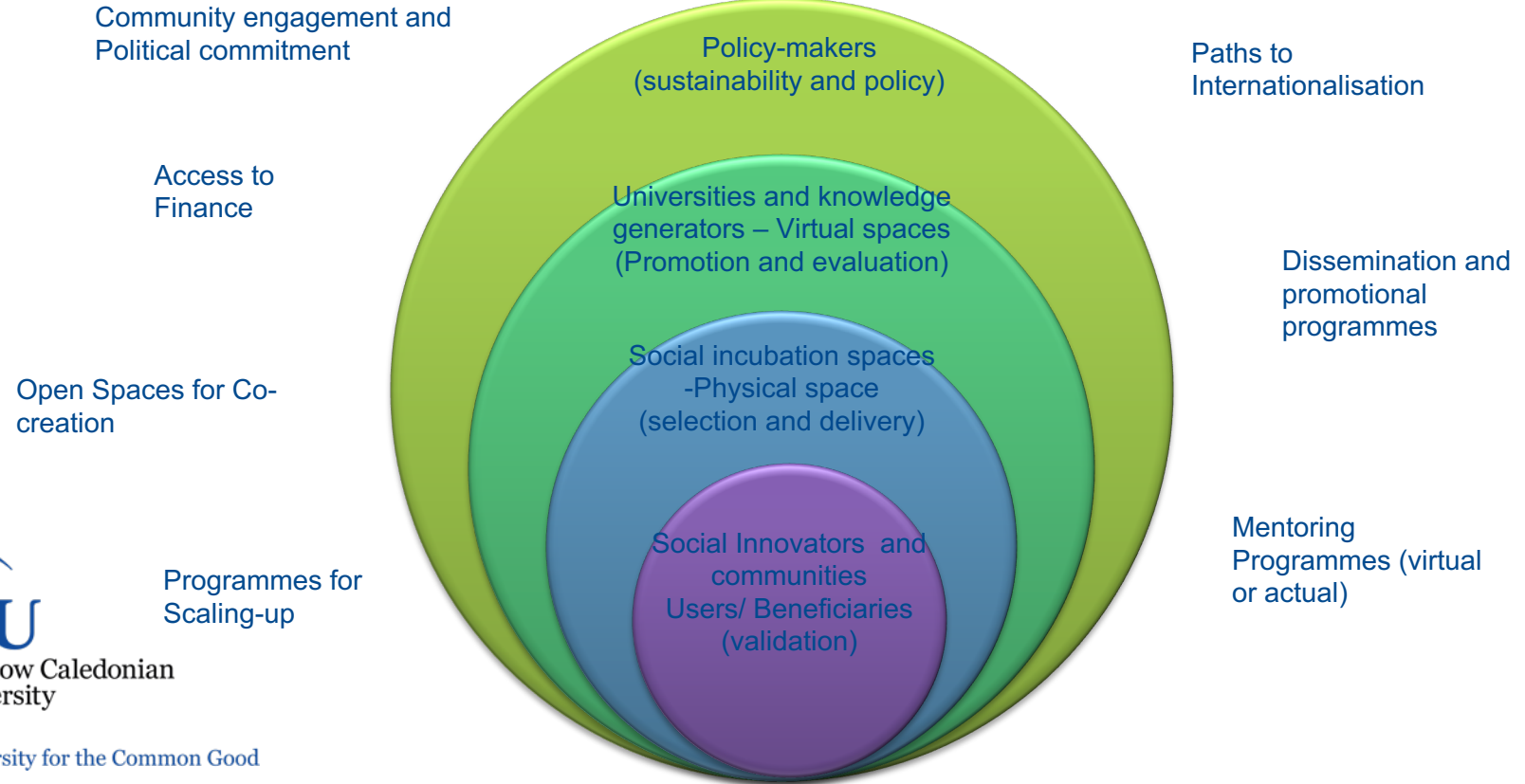


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Social innovation is too reliant on single personalities rather than networks, systems and support structures...

The role of Universities...

Research:

“...social innovation is an emerging field; it remains ill-understood and poorly researched in comparison to its counterparts in business, science and technology” (*Murray, Calulier-Grice and Mulgan, March 2010*).

- Intermediaries between the subversive nature of SI and its need for institutional and political recognition.
- Provide robust evaluations of the effectiveness of SI
- Help to provide an understanding of what can accelerate and scale-up SI, beyond the anecdotal.
- Technical expertise in specialised areas and the means to help SI grow and expand.

The role of Universities...

But also...

Universities are providers of a range of support to their community that provide real added value to SI:

- exploitation of their tacit and codified knowledge
- capacity building, mentoring and training
- specialised equipment
- provision of spaces for networking
- hot-desking or more formal incubation facilities
- selection and evaluation expertise
- lobbying etc.
